Saturday with The Commemorative Air Force

This day is going to be filled with activities that are part of the "Celebrate Freedom 2007" festivities put together by the Tulsa Squadron of the Commemorative Air Force as their annual fundraiser. We will have buses leaving at 9:30 am to take us to the Tulsa Technology Center at the Jones-Riverside Airport in Jenks, OK, for the morning and early afternoon activities.

These activities will include aircraft flyovers and rare military aircraft displays from WW I, WW II, and a Vietnam era helicopter called "Ugly Angel". We have been told that there will be a PT-19 (being re-built), an AT-6 a T-28, C-47, L-5, L-19, B-25, BT-13, P-51, and a Stearman. Included are military vehicles and re-enactors that dress up in period uniforms. Food will be available for you to purchase for

lunch on your own. We'll come back to the hotel by 3 pm, and then buses will transport us back to the

festivities (leaving at 4:30 pm) for the Dinner and Big Band Hangar Dance that starts at 5 pm with dinner (1940s Style Chicken Dinner). There will be a pre-show at 5:30 pm at which **we will be honored**, and then other live entertainment leading up to the dance that begins at 7 pm. Current plans are for the buses to

return to the hotel at 10 pm. The cost of this evening of food and fun is \$25 per person. This is a non-alcohol, non-smoking event in keeping with the policies of both the Tulsa Technology Center and the Tulsa Squadron of the CAF. Additionally, the facility is fully handicapped accessible.

Musings From Our Members...

E-mail from Rudy Rudin via Bob O'Brien:

Hi Bob. You asked me to tell you about my recent trip which relates to being stationed on a beautiful island called "Efate" during WWII. It was the capital of Vanuatu which was in the New Hebrides. The book and movie, Tales of South Pacific, was made about this island. The author was James Michener.

While stationed there I worked as a follow me jeep driver parking airplanes on the strip. The U.S. Government had leased that land from the Bladamire Family who had two beautiful daughters that I had the privilege of meeting.

For years I had longed to return to Efate. "I took the bull by the horns" and on May 14th, 2006, with my son, Allan, flew to Australia and then to Efate. While there we visited their public library and culture center and also met the chiefs of the villages of Vanuatu. Chief Hendon Kalasakau directed me to the Bladamire Family where I once again met one of the daughters, Margarette Collodure. The other daughter had passed away last year.

Margarette hosted a dinner in my honor including important people, and we had an interesting evening going down memory lane. The next day I was interviewed by Mr. Bob Makin, editor of the Vantuatu Independent, which later was printed with a large photo of Margarette and myself on the second page. I had visited many villages and without exception they thanked me for saving their island from the Japanese. All this was certainly a dream come true. I plan to return to Efate this April.

Excerpts of an e-mail from Jerry Bernard, Ulladulla, NSW, Australia:

Dear Cliff: First things first. Your package of memorabilia from the Dayton Reunion arrived today. You can only guess my appreciation to have someone take the time to acknowledge my existence. Thank you.

Like many others, I am high up in my 80's but am holding my own, health-wise. I have managed to beat some nasty things in my time, but I have macular degeneration for which there is no cure and unfortunately my eyes continue to deteriorate. My email address is junto@tpq.com.au

I have dearly wanted to attend one of the reunions, but I don't see myself returning to the States anytime soon. My Australian wife has a great family here and in New Zealand. In fact, she has two great grandchildren and that makes me "Great Grandfather Jerry."

Mass mailing caused 13th AFVA Newsletters to not arrive, so I never got copies. Someone (usually Preston Hill) mailed them individually. I trust someone will remember this poor sole in Australia next time.

Excerpts of a letter from Roy and Joyce Davenport, Portland, OR:

The pictures you sent arrived in good shape and will work really fine for the album I have put together. I have worked on this album since I was discharged in 1945, using the pictures I brought home from the South and Southwest Pacific. It fills one three-inch notebook and part of a two inch. I kept a diary while I was in the Service starting on October 16, 1941 up until I returned to the USA on January 1st 1945.

Spent 33 months overseas from Hawaii to Morotai with the 394th Bomb Squadron. I was assigned to the 4th Reconnaissance Squadron 7th AAF then to the 394th about 10 days later. Into the 13th AAF when it was activated January 13th 1943. I spent my time as an Airplane mechanic and power turret specialist. This is why I wanted, first to be at the reunion, then to get pictures of this Monument for the album. Thank you for sending these pictures. I'll be forever grateful for your good deed.

Our trip to Tinker Air Base, seeing the details of the B2, convinced me of many of my questions about how far we have advanced. I don't believe the farm boy barb wire mechanic skills of the greater generation would work (now) as it did for us.

Those that flew had more to think about besides the enemy, our best never seemed enough but we did our best and always worried until we saw the plane safe on the ground. I was lucky to never have one not come in even though full of holes.
